UCF in Programs

After you apply to a UCF in... Program, you need to set up an interview with the program leader. You can find their email on the program page.

Partner Programs

Once you apply, you will need to complete the [course approval process](#). Once completed, apply to the program on the partner website.

Internship

Once your application as been submitted, send your resume to and set up an advising appointment with olivermcsurley@ucf.edu.

Exchange Programs

If you have not done so already, set up an appointment with the study abroad advisor in your college. You must do so in order to be accepted.

GET ACCEPTED & COMMIT TO YOUR PROGRAM

If you complete the steps above, meet the minimum program requirements, and don't have any disciplinary holds, there is a high chance you'll be accepted into your program. Committing to a study abroad program is a big deal. Doing so means you will be financially responsible for paying for your trip whether you go or not. Make sure you have spoken with your parents/legal guardians, financial aid, and your academic advisor before committing to your program.
